# **PRESIDENT'S CORNER** By Kiyoshi Adachi

At the SCREA January 2016 Board meeting, Mike DeBord reported that the Chuck Reed/Carl DeMaio group put on hold (until probably 2018) their proposal to place a measure on the November 2016 ballot which intended to curb public pension benefits; specifically, close down defined benefit retirement systems (what we have now). Their stated reason: the estimated \$28 million needed to collect signatures and to run a pension change ballot measure campaign and perhaps a better climate for the campaign in 2018. A Sacramento Bee column, dated January 19, 2016, reported in more detail the reasons given for this postponement by the Reed/DeMaio group.

The December 2015 News Briefs reported the Reed/DeMaio group was seeking to file two new ballot proposals entitled "Voter Empowerment Act of 2016". The State Attorney General retitled it as "Public Employees Pension and Retiree Healthcare Benefits". The provisions of the two ballot measures are as follows:

- ⇒ One measure would put employees who first joined a public pension system into a 401 (c) style retirement savings plan that guarantees fixed contributions from employers instead of the promised retirement payment of the defined benefits system.
- ⇒ The second measure would cap the money employers could pay for new hires' retirement to a certain percentage of their salary. For most new employees, employers could contribute no more than 11% of the base compensation to pensions or a maximum of 13% for fire fighters, police and other public safety workers.

The proposal provides voters at the state and local levels to have the power to override the downgraded benefits or the cost caps at the ballot box.

Now, a little news about our membership dues. Some years ago, when the County began reducing the amounts of insurance subsidy payments received by those who were enrolled in the County-sponsored health plans, the SCREA membership voted to increase membership dues to resist this action by the County. The dues increases authorized by a membership vote was \$1.00 per month for retirees and 50 cents per month for affiliates. The SCREA Board retained legal counsel to bring action against Sacramento County to keep this longstanding benefit. The County motioned the Federal Court where the suit was filed to dismiss the retirees action due to there being no written contract or agreement between the County and retirees which guaranteed this benefit. There being no such document, the judge dismissed SCREA's action. The judge ruled there are no triable issues. The retirees claimed longstanding past practice.

So we come to the present. The SCREA Board has decided that the dues increases voted by the membership should no longer be paid by the members because, at the present time, there appears to be no issue foreseeable that would require this increase to be continued to protect membership benefits. Should such a circumstance arise, the membership will again be consulted. Therefore, the SCREA Board has requested our Retirement System (SCERS) to reduce the withholding of membership dues effective July 1, 2016. The \$2.00 dues will be reduced to \$1.00 and the \$1.00 dues will be reduced to 50 cents per month, a 50% decrease in monthly dues.

It's SCREA Board of Directors election time. Voting will take place at the General Membership Meeting, June 17, 2016 at 1:15 p.m. The meeting will convene during intermission of the June Luncheon at the Doubletree Hotel, 2001 Point West Way, Sacramento, CA 95815. Members are encouraged to attend this annual meeting. Members are not required to participate in the luncheon in order to attend this important meeting. There is no cost to attend the meeting. Parking will be covered by SCREA. Bring the parking ticket with you to the meeting to have it validated.

There are five Members on the Board of Directors whose terms are expiring June 30, 2016. Four of the Board members have met the requirements for re-election by submitting Letters of Interest and are Members in good standing. They are Kiyoshi "Pat" Adachi, current SCREA President; Barbara Smith, Vice President; Randy Angeloni, current Legislative Committee Chair; and Carol Mosier, current SCREA Database Management Committee Chair.

SCREA Bylaws. Article VII, Elections, Section 5, state, "A written ballot election will not be necessary should the number of candidates not exceed the number of vacancies. Should the number of candidates not exceed the number of vacancies, the Nominating Committee Chair or his/her designee shall announce the official slate of candidates and request a voice vote for the election of the new Directors." Therefore, a voice vote for the three incumbents will be conducted. SCREA Members in attendance at the General Membership Meeting will give their voice vote at the June 17th General Membership Meeting.

In addition to the aforementioned positions, there are two additional vacancies on the Board. Letters of Interest have not been received in time to meet the press date for this issue of NEWS BRIEFS and to be included in this June Election. Appointments to these two vacancies and vacancies that occur after June 30th will be recommended by the Nominating Committee to the Board of Directors President for appointment. Vic will serve until a replacement is appointed. Vic has asked the Board to actively seek his replacement now and appoint someone as soon as possible to allow adequate time for training and to become familiar with the Treasurer's duties. The Treasurer is an Officer of the Board of Directors. Either Vic's replacement will be elected from the current Board or President Adachi will appoint a SCREA Member to the Board for the purpose of filling this position, which would then be ratified by the Board of Directors.

A full Board is needed to fulfill our mission and represent all retired County employees in many areas. ## SCREA BYLAWS REVISIONS SCHEDULED BEFORE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP FOR VOTE OF APPROVAL By Linda Kimura, Secretary

Revised SCREA Bylaws are scheduled for the June General Membership Meeting on June 17, 2016. The meeting begins at 1:15 p.m. at the Doubletree Hotel, 2001 Point West Way, Sacramento, CA 95815. The revisions reflect various recommendations and changes proposed over the course of several months in 2014 and 2015 by the SCREA Board of Directors. The revisions were approved by the SCREA Board on March 7, 2016.

In general, the revisions are mainly simple word and punctuation changes for a more consistent document. The major revisions are as follows:

- Reference to specific dates and deadlines were removed in an attempt to be less restrictive to Board Members when setting deadlines for specific tasks year after year.
- Changes to Article III Membership and Article IX, Committees reflect the additions/ consolidation of certain committees and some committee duties. Membership is changed to Membership and SCERS Orientations; Website is combined with Information to form Information and Website; and SCREA Database Management has been added, separating these duties from the former Information Committee.
- Secretary is added to the list of Officers in Article V, and to the Executive Committee in Article IX, Committees, since the Executive Committee is made up of Officers.
- Revisions to Article VII, Elections reflect a more realistic process for recruiting for Members of the Board of Directors and for accepting letters of interest year round. Adhering to specific dates have proved to be too restrictive when coordinating dates with Board Meetings and NEWS BRIEFS deadlines each year.

Approving these Bylaws changes is one of the privileges of being a Member of SCREA. It allows the opportunity for Members to have a say in how this important organization operates and represents its members in retirement security issues.

Members are urged to attend the June General Membership Meeting on Friday, June 17, 2016 at 1:15 p.m. Bring your parking ticket with you to the meeting for proper validation. The cost of parking will be paid by SCREA.

## BENEFITS REPORT By Kiyoshi Adachi

Are there any premium increases anticipated for the County-sponsored health plans? The County Employee Benefits Office (EBO) tells us price hikes have doubled the average drug prices over 7 years. The price hikes are not limited to specialty drugs such as for cancer, hepatitis C and rare diseases but also everyday prescription medication. Price hikes for drugs are reflected in increased health plan premiums. So, what's the outlook for Sacramento County sponsored health plans? We'll know sometime in August when the EBO tells the Board of Supervisors what the premiums will be for 2017.

Recently, a retiree who was previously enrolled in the County health plan (Medicare Advantage, Kaiser) had switched coverage to an equivalent Kaiser individual plan because of a big difference in the premium. Of course, the individual plan premium was lower and he wanted to know why. This is not the first time I have been asked this question. Same for the EBO. The EBO has told those asking the question the benefits are not the same and to compare the benefits and costs detailed in the County's booklet, which retirees receive yearly prior to annual enrollment with benefits and costs of the individual plan they have acquired. Discussion on this subject at a recent SCREA Board meeting indicates that the co-pays and costs of tests are higher for the individual plans. So, should an enrollee be a heavy and frequent user of the plan, being enrolled in the County-sponsored plan could be less costly. So there you are. One size doesn't fit all. We all have to do the math.

**I-5, HEADING NORTH:** Take I-5 to HWY 50. Take HWY 50 east to Business 80/Capital City Freeway east. Exit at Arden Way east, keep right. Take the first right onto Point West Way.

**I-5, HEADING SOUTH:** Take the Garden Highway exit, turning left onto Garden Highway. Continue on Garden Highway, which turns into Arden-Garden Connector. Continue on Arden-Garden Connector as it turns into Arden Way. Follow Arden Way, going under Business 80. Turn right onto Point West Way, and right into the Sacramento hotel's parking lot.

# WHO ARE YOU, REALLY? By Randy Angeloni

The CRCEA conference in Stockton had a segment on Genealogy. That got me to thinking, where are my ancestors from, what is my family history, where did I come from? What is my family's story? The more you ask, the more questions come to mind. There are tales passed down through the decades. There are pictures of some of my relatives but what is their story? What does it mean to me? My mother is 92 and has a clear mind and good memory. I asked for information about her childhood, education, life with 17 siblings (21 live births), about her life in northern Maine in the late 20's. What she told me opened up a boxcar full of new questions.

Come to find out, I am related to settlers who came to the new world in the late 1500's and early 1600's through Canada to settle in, what is today, northern Maine. 'Acadians', know for a group of settlers predominantly from France, migrated through modern day Canada to upstate Maine.

You get drawn into the history, the life style, and the culture of the early immigrants. WOW, my people helped settle this country! But wait, some wound up on the other side of the law... Maybe we don't want to know... Let's think about it!!! OK, done thinking, I still want to know.

So where do we begin? The best place to start your search is to ask your direct relatives. Start by defining a starting person. What were their names, relationship to your starting person, birth days, location of birth, etc? Any information will help you along the way.

My dad started out with pencil and paper, but before he died he had reams of paper to go through. My dad's list got me started. Do yourself a favor, get some genealogical charts off the internet or go to one of the many online websites which are great search resources. As of this point I have my Mom's ancestry back to about 930 AD and have more than 1500 persons identified.

You can start your search at the Family Search Centers. The center closest to me is:

Or start online. One very popular online URL is www.familysearch.org which is free as long as you create a log on. I use www.Ancestry.com which will keep tract of my family tree. It is a subscription site and is fee based. I also use Family Tree Maker which integrates with Ancestry.com so I can keep adding to the program from other sources. With the advent of DNA markers which are readily available, you can scientifically see what your genetic background is and even be matched with relatives you may not even know you had. If you want to know your story, start looking. History can be fun, especially if it's your history.
